



Weekly Incident Summary March 9-15, 2020



Monday, March 9, 2020

09:17 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on James Young Dr. On scene fire staff entered the home, and using detectors found zero readings throughout. The activation may have been caused by the use of hair products in the area of the smoke alarm on the second floor.

20:18 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Atwood Ave. On scene fire staff assisted Halton Regional Paramedics with patient care and loading the patient into the ambulance and cleared the scene.

Wednesday, March 11, 2020

08:31 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Ninth Line & Steeles Ave. Halton Regional Police and Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene. Fire staff stabilized the vehicles and assisted with patient care.

11:37 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a dump truck on fire on 17 Sideroad. On scene fire staff found the engine had malfunctioned and oil leaking from the vehicle. Fire staff applied absorbant to contain the leaking oil.

16:46 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a three-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Dublin Line and Hwy 7 in Acton. Halton Regional Police and Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene. Fire staff assisted with traffic control until cleared.

Friday, March 13, 2020

05:50 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a hydro pole on fire on Third Line in Acton. On scene fire staff found a small glow coming from above the breaker. No fire and no wires down. Hydro was notified and upon their arrival fire staff were cleared.

19:22 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a single vehicle into a hydro pole on 15 Sideroad. On scene fire was advised they were not required.

20:05 Hours - Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Danby Rd. While enroute fire was advised this was a false alarm. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who advised that burnt food on the stove had caused the alarm to activate. The false alarm was confirmed with no further concerns.

Saturday, March 14, 2020

12:22 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Beardmore Cres in Acton. On scene fire staff provided patient care until Halton Regional Paramedics arrived.

16:40 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Davidson Dr in Acton. On arrival staff confirmed a false alarm due to owner replacing batteries.

16:57 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Tenth Line. On arrival staff confirmed a false alarm due to dust created by cleaning staff.

Sunday, March 15, 2020

19:42 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Shortill Rd in Ballinifad. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who did not have a valid burn permit. The fire was extinguished and the burn permit process was explained for any future burns.

22:29 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on John St. Halton Regional Police and Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival. Fire staff assisted with gaining entrance and cleared the scene.
