



GLEN WILLIAMS MATURE NEIGHBOURHOOD STUDY STEERING COMMITTEE – MEMBERSHIP OPPORTUNITY

The Town of Halton Hills is seeking volunteers who are interested in serving on the Steering Committee for the Glen Williams Mature Neighbourhood Study.

This Study will examine the issue of large home re-builds in the older, established residential neighbourhoods of Glen Williams to determine if the regulatory framework of the Town's Zoning By-law is effective in maintaining the character and integrity of these neighbourhoods. The role of the Steering Committee will be to:

- provide comments during the study process;
- assist with issue identification and resolution;

- be a resident and/or land owner of property in Glen Williams;
- be over the age of 18 years;
- demonstrate a strong knowledge or interest in maintaining the character of of Glen Williams; and,
- not be employed by the Town of Halton Hills.
