



## Weekly Incident Summary October 7-13, 2019



### Tuesday, October 8, 2019

**13:00 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Ray Lawn Cres. Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene and advised fire was not required.

**16:33 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to the report of a garbage bin on fire on Guelph St. On scene fire staff found a small garbage can smoldering. The fire had been extinguished prior to fire's arrival, by the schools custodian. Fire crews applied water to ensure the fire was extinguished.

**17:29 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Guelph St & Sinclair Ave. Halton Regional Police were on scene upon arrival. Fire staff provided patient care until Halton Regional Paramedics arrived and cleared the scene.

**20:07 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Confederation St in Glen Williams. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. It is suspected that a hair product had triggered the alarm.

**22:12 Hours** – Fire fighters returned to the report of a vehicle fire in the area of Regional Road 25 and 25 Sideroad in Acton. Fire staff searched the area and no vehicle was found.

**23:09 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Lauchlin Cres. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who advised this was a false alarm. The alarm system was triggered by a steam ventilator in the upstairs bedroom.

**23:20 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to the report of a brush fire in the area of Maria St & Poplar Ave in Acton. Halton Regional Police reported the small fire was extinguished prior to arrival and advised the fire department was not required.

### Wednesday, October 9, 2019

**00:21 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to the report of a garbage bin on fire in the area of Wallace St Division St in Acton. On scene fire staff found a yard waste bag on fire. The contents of the bag were extinguished by fire staff.

**06:36 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Trafalgar Rd. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who advised that no alarm had sounded. Fire staff confirmed no concerns and advised building personnel to have their system inspected.

**16:54 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Hornby Rd. On scene fire staff provided patient care until Halton Regional Paramedics arrived.

### Thursday, October 10, 2019

**19:59 Hours** - Fire fighters responded to the report of a possible structure fire in the area of Todd Rd & Mountainview Rd N. Halton Regional Police were on scene upon arrival. The building is currently under construction and the flames the caller saw were from a propane heater. There were no other issues at this property.

### Friday, October 11, 2019

**07:47 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Main St N in Acton. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who advised that a sprinkler valve had been accidentally struck, causing the alarm to sound.

**09:39 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Munro Circle. On scene fire staff entered the home, and using detectors found zero readings throughout.

**11:50 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Fourth Line in Erin. On scene fire staff met with farm personnel who advised that a blacksmith in shoeing horses had made some smoke which activated the alarm. No further concerns.

**12:29 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Steeles Ave & Trafalgar Rd. Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival and advised fire was not required.

**17:30 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of 10 Sideroad and Sixth Line. Halton Regional Police and Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival and advised fire was not required.

**19:26 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to a public assist on Mill St E in Acton. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who advised that they came out of their apartment and saw a newspaper on fire by the front door in the mailbox. Fire staff confirmed the fire was extinguished and contacted Halton Regional Police to attend.

### Saturday, October 12, 2019

**12:49 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Steeles Ave. On scene fire staff met with security who confirmed there were no concerns. The alarm was reset and fire cleared the scene.

**16:57 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to the report of a motor vehicle collision in the area of Tenth Line and 10 Sideroad. Halton Regional Police were on scene upon arrival and advised fire was not required.

**17:22 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Edward St. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who did not have a valid burn permit. The fire was extinguished and the burn permit process was explained.

**18:57 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Main St in Acton. On scene fire staff entered the home, and using detectors found zero readings throughout.

### Sunday, October 13, 2019

**17:12 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on 17 Sideroad. On scene fire staff provided patient care until Halton Regional paramedics arrived.

**17:32 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Armstrong Ave. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who advised that they were having problems with some machinery, causing the pressure to drop and the alarm to activate. Fire staff confirmed no concerns and cleared the scene.

**17:30 Hours** – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Allison Crt. On scene fire staff met with the homeowners who did have a valid burn permit but were burning during a burn ban. The fire was extinguished with no further concerns.

### Weekly Safety Message

There may be an intruder lurking in your home from which no burglar alarm can protect you. Carbon monoxide is invisible and odourless and it can kill you. We recommend that you have your chimney, furnace and gas-fired appliances checked annually by professional technicians. Remember, only a carbon monoxide alarm can alert you to the presence of this deadly gas.
